How It All Started

Aligarh Muslim University in India, established by the eminent Sir Syed Ahmed Khan in the 19th century, is considered to be a citadel of learning. 40 years ago a group of people from this prominent university made the decision to create an educational institution in Pakistan on similar lines to the Aligarh University. This decision was made in direct response to the paucity of educational institutions in the country that could provide quality education at affordable rates to the youth. The Tehzib-ul-Akhlaq Trust was created to realise three main objectives. Firstly, to establish educational institutions culminating in the foundation of an educational centre on the lines of Aligarh Muslim University; secondly, to establish a modern and well-equipped library and thirdly to regularly publish a periodical. Ever since its establishment more than half a century ago, the Trust has worked to realise these objectives.

Aligarh Higher Secondary Public School & College For Girls, Gulberg

This was the first institution established by the Trust in 1965. It houses 36 classrooms, 3 science laboratories, 2 computer labs, 1 library, 1 auditorium, 1 staff room and a dispensary. More than 1,100 students are currently enrolled. Currently the Trust is undertaking the upgrading of the institution to degree level. The Trust plans on starting classes at this higher level by April 2006.

Aligarh Public School & College (Residential) for Boys, Manga

This institution located on Multan Road at Manga - 38 km from Lahore, was established in 1967. It was established with the objective of providing quality education and residential facilities for boys. The institution currently caters to the needs of more than 190 students. The Trust is undertaking the upgrading of the institution to higher secondary level and plans are also underway to turn it into a technical university on the pattern of Aligarh University.



What Sets TAT Apart

Through these institutions, an effort is being made to provide quality education to the youth of the country. Keeping the spirit of religious and patriotic fervor alive is a visible objective. In both schools to distinguish class section from each other, the names of famous figures from the Independence movement - MJ for Muhammad Ali Johar, WM for Waqar ul Mulk etc have been used. This essentially serves the purpose of instilling in the students a familiarity, an identification and most importantly, a sense of pride for these leaders. The construction and subsequent expansion of the schools follows the pattern set by Sir Syed Ahmed Khan - i.e a 'Donate a room' policy. Plaques outside the donated rooms remind of the generous contributions made by donors.

A regular monitoring system has been implemented via monthly, term and annual papers, the results of which are shared with parents. Both schools aim not only at providing quality education but also at enhancing other skills of the students. This is achieved through debates, essay competitions, literary gatherings and sports competitions which are held on a regular basis.

The trust strives to provide quality education at affordable rates. The tuition fee charged has been developed with the view of keeping it as affordable as possible. Besides this, at present approximately 10% of the students in each school are being provided free education. To incentivise good performance the Trust also offers 2-year scholarship to the students who secure top positions at the secondary level.
